- **Recognition of 2022 Hall of Fame Class:**

There were no applications submitted in 2022 for the Hall of Fame.

- **Mechanics Changes for 2022:** Jeff Nettles presented the mechanics changes:

1. EDITORIAL CHANGES:

- ANYTIME THERE IS A COUNTING SITUATION YOU CONFIRM WITH CLOSED FIST.
- ADDED ABOVE HEAD WITH COUNT WHEN MORE THAN ONE RECEIVER OFF THE LINE ON YOUR SIDE OF SNAPPER. INCLUDES WING BACK. ONLY WHEN MORE THAN ONE

2. OFFICIAL UNIFORM AND EQUIPMENT:

- ADDED: RADIOS MAY BE USED DURING GAMES WITH CONSENSUS OF THE CREW TO ASSIST IN COMMUNICATION

3. BACK JUDGE POSITIONING BEFORE SNAP:

- POSITION BETWEEN 20-25 YARDS BEYOND THE DEFENSIVE LOS UNLESS FORCED DEEPER BY DEFENSIVE ALIGNMENT

4. SEVEN MAN MECHANICS:

- DELETED PARAGRAPH THAT REQUIRED HL/LJ TO COUNT 7 ON THE LOS

- CHANGED FJ/SJ RESPONSIBILITY FOR GOAL LINE IF SNAPPED 7 YARD LINE TO

CORRESPOND TO CHANGE MADE LAST YEAR BUT NOT UPDATED

5. BACK JUDGE GOAL LINE COVERAGE:

- BJ WILL START ON END LINE STARTING AT 15 YARD LINE OR INSIDE BJ HAS PRIMARY GOAL LINE COVERAGE UP TO THE 15 YARD LINE. BJ SHOULD BE PREPARED TO MOVE AND COVER END LINE ONCE READING THE PLAY AND IT DICTATES END LINE COVERAGE. BJ SHOULD START PLAY EITHER ON THE END LINE OR THE GOAL LINE BUT NEVER IN CENTER OF END ZONE. THUS BJ GIVES UP GOAL LINE AT 15 YARD LINE.

6. SUBVARSITY TIMING:

- FOR ALL SUB VARSITY CONTEST, THE CLOCK WILL START ON THE READY-FOR-PLAY SIGNAL AFTER ALL CHANGE OF POSSESSIONS REGARDLESS OF WHAT CAUSED THE CLOCK TO STOP. (ONLY EXCEPTION IS IF A TEAM TAKES A CHARGED TIMEOUT BY EITHER TEAM BEFORE THE READY FOR PLAY).

Mechanics proposal for new legal intentional grounding rule:

8.2 FORWARD PASS PLAY: PAGE 24 REFEREE AFTER THE SNAP:

ADD: The referee is responsible for a legal pass intentionally thrown away for the purpose of saving yardage as far as penalizing and determining if pass made it to the neutral zone or beyond with assistance from HL/LJ if they can assist. A short conference with crew will take place if necessary.

8.2 FORWARD PASS PLAYS: PAGE 25 UMPIRE AFTER SNAP:

ADD: Has secondary help to the Referee on pass reaching or crossing neutral zone on intentional grounding rule

8.2 FORWARD PASS PLAYS: PAGE 25 LINESMAN/LINE JUDGE

AFTER THE SNAP:

ADD: If able assist Referee as to whether the pass reaches or crossed neutral zone. If necessary meet with Referee for short conference to determine location of the pass.
