



HALL OF FAME

Selection Criteria & Eligibility Checklist

Nominations

Any registered official of SCFOA or retired member may, through their District Director, nominate individuals for election to the SCFOA Hall of Fame. All nominations must reach the SCFOA Vice President by February 1 of each year.

		<i>Note: Officials inducted under retired criteria are no longer eligible for SCHSL-assigned varsity games. Officiating such a game after induction results in immediate HOF termination.</i>	

Criteria for Induction

Amending Criteria: The selection criteria may be changed by a majority vote of at least 5 of the 7 members of the SCFOA Hall of Fame Committee.

Verification: Each District Director provides the Hall of Fame Committee with written verification and supporting documentation for nominees from their district.

Selection Process: A 7-member committee (sitting President, VP, and five HOF members) reviews nominations by secret ballot each spring. At least 5 of 7 affirmative votes are required for election.

Unsuccessful Nominees: Nominations remain active for 3 years if not elected. After 3 years, the candidate is removed. A 1-year wait is required before re-nomination.

Recognition: Inductees are formally presented at the annual clinic, inscribed on the HOF plaque at the SCHSL office, and receive a personal wall plaque.

Induction Ceremony: Held every two years in January. Funded by a portion of annual SCFOA dues.
